Qualified applicants must be 18 years or older, enjoy and have experience working with children, and possess a passion for nature and the great outdoors. A natural science education and/or background is preferred. Animal handling familiarity is a plus!

Camp weeks run from Tuesday, May 19 through Friday July 31st. The hours are 8:00 a.m. to 3:30 p.m., five days per week. Half day camp hours are 8:00-12:30 and have limited availability. Must be able to commit to a schedule of at least five weeks of work for the summer. Extra hours may be available for camp pre-care or after-care.

Job Responsibilities:

- Supervise children ages 4 to 11 in indoor and various outdoor settings.
- Plan, organize, and lead educational and recreational curriculum for the natural world and heritage education, the environment, history, and water themed camps to include hikes, animal demonstrations, science experiments, games and crafts.
- Create a positive, supportive, safe learning environment.
- Provide instruction and direction to weekly camp volunteers.

Qualifications:

- 18 years or older.

- College classes or background in environmental or history education, natural sciences or early education preferred.
- Ability to work well with others.
- Animal handling skills, including reptiles, a plus.
- Must have dependable transportation.
- Must pass criminal background check.
